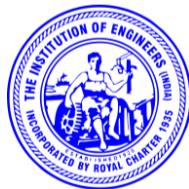

Engineers whose qualification is BE / B Tech or equivalent, recognized by the Statutory Authority or Government of India and who are having 5 years or more experience, having membership of a recognized professional society and having maintained continuous professional development at satisfactory level, can submit application in the prescribed format to the PE Cell, The Institution of Engineers (India), 8 Gokhale Road, Kolkata-700020.

- * Having Bachelor's Degree in Engineering or equivalent recognised by Statutory Authority or Government of India
- * Minimum 5 years', professional experience
- * Membership of recognised professional engineering institution / association
- * Maintained Continued Professional Development (CPD) at a satisfactory level

WHY ONE SHOULD BECOME PE?

The function of IEI will be to grant appropriate certificate of competence to individuals to practice as “**Professional Engineers**” and to develop the profession of Engineering and to regulate the profession through a “**Code of Ethics**”. In furtherance of these functions of the profession, it will be aimed that only a **Professional Engineer**, either working individually or in an organizational set-up will approve designs/drawings/reports/products before these are released for use by the public at large. Such certified professional engineers will be designated as **Professional Engineer (PE)**.

Establishment of Students Chapters of IEI

The Council may establish Engineering College Students' Chapters or Polytechnic Students' Chapters at engineering colleges or polytechnics conducting courses recognized by the Institution with the concurrence of the managing authorities of the respective engineering colleges or polytechnics and notify the establishment to the State Centre within the geographical boundaries of which such Chapter will be located.

Guidelines of Opening new Students' Chapter

1. Initial request from an Engineering College/a Polytechnic to be made to the Director - Membership of IEI expressing desire to open a Students' Chapter at the Engineering College/Polytechnic mentioning the branches of engineering.
2. (i) In a College/University/Institution, atleast 50 numbers of students irrespective of the year of study in the same branch of engineering is required for opening a Students' Chapter.

(ii) To enable formation of a Chapter in any recognised Polytechnic, minimum number of members required is 50. There shall be only one Chapter in a Polytechnic. This strength of membership shall be mandatory for opening as also for continuing a Students Chapter. However, it is requested to motivate all the students to enrol themselves in the Chapter.

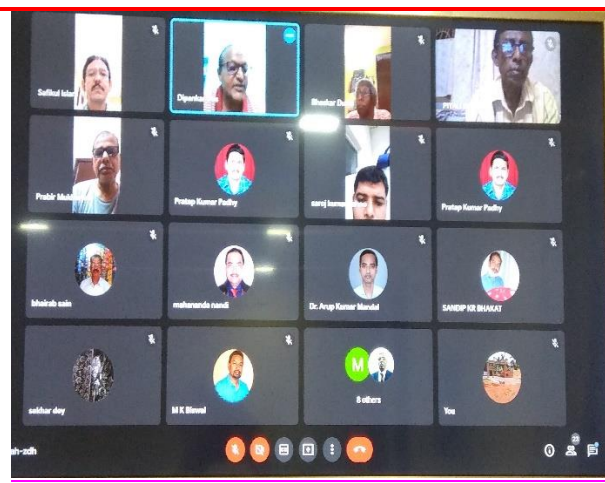
3. Upon obtaining the permission and code of the new Students' Chapter from IEI, prospective Chapters have to download the forms (for Engineering College Students' Members (ECSC) and Polytechnic Students' Member (PSC) from the webpage www.ieindia.org.
4. The forms have to be filled up by the students willing to be members of Students' Chapter in consultation with the Adviser. The respective Advisers of the Engineering College/ Polytechnic will then be awarding the membership no. as per the guidelines.

Report on the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of The Institution of Engineers (India) Durgapur Local Centre ("the Institution"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2023 signed by us under reference to this report and the related Income and Expenditure Account and the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as „financial statement“) [in which have been incorporated the returns /accounts received from the various Local Centres of the Institution for the year ended 31st March, 2023 as audited by other auditors and which have been relied upon by us].

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements of the Institution give the information in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles and the applicable Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and read with the Other Matters paragraph below, give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Institution as at March 31, 2023 its surplus/(deficit) and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the financial statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SA) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. 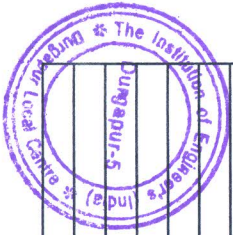
